Agenda Items:

1. Update on Strategic Plan Next Steps: Tricia

Jen shared Tricia's email on the Strategic Plan updates:

Q4 2024:

 Before the November Council meeting, Tricia will be working with each team to solidify their metric and baseline. Several are completed but we need all of these in place and easily trackable.

Q1 2025:

- Recall that the Strategic Plan is a 3-year plan, so we will not "redo" this exercise next year. Rather, each team will be asked to dust off their plans.
- Confirm tactics (or make limited edits for 2025)
- Map out quarterly milestones.
- Set process measures.
- We also need to have visibility to progress at staff meetings (monthly) and Council meetings (quarterly). Tricia will work with teams to make progress tracking simple.

2. Update on Organ Fund: Dianne

- a. We have 82 pledges 104,680 as of today, 3 of these account for 55,000, November 24 is the final date for pledges, checks with pledges, have not been cashed and will stay locked up until after the pledge drive.
- b. Jen asked are they willing to give to other projects.
- c. Pastor Jon said this is a tough one their hearts are in around this. It is a question on how we are handing hearts, a question on the back end, who knows how this is all going to play out.
- d. Todd said we never had a pipe organ.
- e. Pastor Jon said for some people the pipes are important.
- f. Jen K asked about the second installment, 30 days from now.
- g. Kevin said people have asked if we can do a QCD for the pipes, it will be a case-by-case situation.
- h. Dianne said this is a plug and play and the speakers will be placed above the organ where they are currently.

3. Financial Update: Dianne / Kevin

- a. Jen K. said the total giving contributions down from YTD budget last month down 157,000.
- b. Total expenses were down, managing expenses well net short fall 16,000, we have investment income.
- c. The fund projections have us taking a 10-year average of giving and current contributions today we would have 150,000 deficits compared to the budget.
- d. Benevolence was not paid this month. Next month will look on track.
- e. Jen asked does benevolence change based on income or is it by budget?
- f. Dianne said it is paid regardless of incoming revenue.
- g. As we look at the budget in 2025 this is an area we may have to cut.

- h. Pastor Jon said when we set our budget, this is our commitment to our partners, as we look at 2025 what is our percentage of budget to keep us in alignment, it is not just the bottom line and the in-kind donations. There are a lot of asks of the congregations. We will have to look at the whole budget in entirety.
- i. Dianne said we have budgeted annual 30,000 for visitors, it is good to see our visitor actual revenue going up higher than predicted.
- j. Jen said were doing an excellent job on expenses,
- k. Dianne said it is personnel and building expenses. Excel bill is lower. Where we got hit was office expenses.
- I. Pastor Jon said one thing to take note is the comparable 2024 to 2023 one thing we were impacted by was 3M as you compare by year, we're doing relatively well, it is a shock to hear the numbers but looking at what we lost as far as giving. It is positive for visitor contributions.
- m. Dianne said when people are not on our roster, they are considered visitors, if they give 3 gifts in a row, we can invite them to explore King of Kings, when we have a first-time visitor gift, we send a thank you note, with online visitors we send an email, email that calls themselves anonymous, we do our best with all.
- n. Just curious and was not sure how that was handled, any other giving things happening.
- o. Dianne said we have a few families giving only to organ fund and not to general fund, we have four asks going at the same time, of displays in the gathering space has to do we need to get a grasp on how many things we are asking for and what we should uplift. Most of this is above benevolence.
- p. Jen said I did want to ask about the stewardship, what else do you need, can we help, I love the theme, Todd and Jason have all the stewardship on their minds from working on the leadership.
- q. Jason asked can I comment on that, Dianne's idea of a Father Daughter dance, maybe we can use something smaller and more focused as an activity, Dianne is great to do in the MPR and use that as a fund raiser to spruce up the MPR, not to pay off mortgage, lets get out get together type of mode.
- r. Jason said I thought let's get a group together to figure this out, red carpet, photo booth, it could be cool.
- s. Jen K. said maybe one in Community Ed not sure what is called.
- t. Jason said I think we will call it Daddy Daughter dance.
- u. Dianne said you would have the list from American girl camps.
- v. Jason said on the invites, come with your daughter and bring their friends.
- w. Jen said we can get bigger girls to work the photo both.
- x. Jason said we need to talk to Michael then for service hours.
- y. Pastor Jon said we are looking at the week before Thanksgiving as a potential build piece, we are looking at something in the gathering space, we will look at something different.

- Building Updates
 - a) Dianne, the compressor has been replaced, was concerned about pipes, we have a couple updates due from the inspections, some sprinkler heads need to be replaced, the bill was about 12,000.
 - b) I think it's good for the congregations to know some of the expenses.
 - c) Dianne said it is a wake-up call that the new side of the building is 18 years old, we have things over time that need to be replaced, we need to build up cash for these items. Johnny is working on the railing. Winter is always a concerning time, ice dams water pipes, a lot of due diligence of things to do before the winter. If we get tons of snow, we will have leaks.
 - d) Dianne, some of it is removing snow. We put heating elements on the sanctuary roof, that has really helped us as that was an area that would get ice dams.
 - e) Jen said I remembered a lot of people got ice dams a couple of years ago.
 - f) Pastor Jon said the offer to help with Stewardship did not fall on deaf ears, so Thank You!
 - g) Jen said we need to look at what the congregation will participate in and to see what they can rally behind and have fun.

Pastor Jon

Leadership:

- We continue to live into our second E4 Strategy which focuses on Engagement. We are not only
 seeing this theme played out in ministry but uplifted in worship through our "Connected Lives" series
 as well as the newly created Skills and Interests booklet. As we did with our Encourage them last
 year, it is great to have an annual focus that we are naturally living into.
- Whenever a new staff member comes onboard, we take time to review our relational covenant and
 what it means to live in community with one another. It's a great check-in and check-up. We will
 continue to unpack it in the following weeks as we seek to maintain a healthy team/staff
 environment.
- We are in the process of getting a better handle on gathering space displays, congregational asks and Milestone cadence as they relate to worship. This has been an intentional focus in the past as it impacts other congregational initiatives and our general operating budget.
- Planning Page update: With Isabelle Hammond onboard as our Marketing Specialist, we will be leveraging the Planning Sheets as a baseline for communication. Team members have been instructed to utilize this resource along with in person dialogue with Isabelle to ensure ministry needs are being communicated. From the planning pages, Isabelle will identify the critical announcements for the weekend and how to best disperse additional information to the congregation. This will be a director level initiative across ministry lines to be sure that information is clearly provided. Once again, our main objective is to move ministry beyond day-to-day planning to discussions surrounding evaluation and long-range visioning, planning and implementation.
- As we live into our engagement strategy, Laurel will be working with her team on garnering pictures of families engaged in education which will help with our connection through ACS.
- This year's Stewardship Campaign theme is "For Every Season" and will be leveraging several Legacy Gifting Concepts and language. The Campaign speaks into the various seasons of life that we find ourselves going through and how we can be invited into a new season of giving that supports the mission and ministry of King of Kings. An article was written highlighting this campaign in the Quarterly Update that will be going out with Giving Statements. The Stewardship Campaign is slotted for January.

Worship:

- We are currently in our "Connected Lives" Series. Isabelle is buttoning up the Advent Devotional that
 goes along with our series, "ChristMESS God's Gift for a Messy World." Work continues on our
 Lenten Series and Devotional. I am working on a 40-day reflection that challenges readers to prepare
 their hearts for the next day.
- It is great having Pastor Amelia pouring new energy into the wording around the Baptismal Service and re-write several Faith Milestone blessings including Welcome to Kids of the Kingdom, Bible Blessing and Confirmation. New this year was a welcome to Confirmation milestone. Kudos! It's great to have a different voice and being invited into the revision process. It's a great partnership.
